## 1. What's Happening on Campus?

- The University of Findlay continues to improve its campus for students – and when it comes to keeping fit, there's no exception. **UF's Cardio Center**, located on the second floor of the Koehler Fitness and Recreation Complex, contains 12 treadmills, 12 natural runners, eight exercise bikes, 20 weight machines, 12 plyo balls and 10 stretching mats. All of that is in addition to dumbbells and jump ropes, as well as televisions and background music. Other benefits include heart rate monitors on all cardio machines and personalized workouts put together by students in strength and conditioning classes. Future plans include updating cardio machines every three years and installing personalized televisions in all treadmills. Last year, the Cardio Center averaged 380-400 patrons per day. The facility is open to UF students, faculty, staff and retirees.

- **Robert Sabuda and Matthew Reinhart, internationally recognized masters of creating pop-up book art**, highlighted the **Mazza Museum's 25th Annual Celebration** on Sept. 30. Approximately 450 people attended their presentation, where the duo talked about their work. Both told the audience that they had been artists since childhood, constantly drawing and making things. Sabuda, who grew up in Pinckney, Mich., made his first pop-ups as a child, and then as an adult taught himself the intricacies of paper engineering. Reinhart, from Cedar Rapids, Iowa, originally studied biology in preparation for a career in medicine but went on to the Pratt Institute in New York City, instead, where he met Sabuda. Sabuda and Reinhart now have a design studio in New York City with seven people working for them. Their books are hand assembled in Thailand and China, where 10,000 to 15,000 books are produced each week. According to Sabuda, the most difficult part of making a pop-up is to design it so that it will close easily. Their biggest pop-up is the monkey temple in "The Jungle Book," which is nearly two feet tall. Another engineering challenge was creating the Darth Vader helmet for "Star Wars: a Pop-up Guide to the Galaxy." Reinhart called it "one of the most complex ever." Mazza patrons snapped up 180 copies of the Star Wars book and signed up for more on order, along with purchasing copies of Sabuda and Reinhart's other works. In all, Sabuda and Reinhart graciously autographed more than 1,000 books for eager fans. "We're big kids. We make books the child in us really likes," Sabuda said.

## 2. Academic Update

- Through Oct. 26, the University is hosting **Fulbright Scholar-in-Residence Murtala Bidmos, Ph.D.**, professor of Islamic education and campus imam at the University of Lagos in Nigeria, an institution of 48,000 students. Bidmos’ primary focus of study while in America is religion and its role in society. While on campus, he has been working with members of the religious studies faculty, speaking to classes, attending on-campus events, visiting non-profit organizations and conducting religious services for Muslims on campus. He also has participated in community services at St. Paul’s United Methodist Church and gave a public lecture at Ohio Northern University. The scholar has authored multiple books on the topic of Islamic studies and has written many published articles. He is married and has four grown children.

• **The Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) has granted The University of Findlay's School of Pharmacy candidate certification**, which means that students who graduate from the program may sit for the licensure examination. Students are prepared to sit for the examination following completion of the six-year program, during which they earn a doctor of pharmacy degree. The University has 240 students enrolled in the six-year program this academic year. Sixty students are enrolled in each of the first, second, third and fourth years. #### **4. Alumni Spotlight**

- **Eliz Sanasarian**, Ph.D. '75 held her audiences captive as she talked to classes and gave a presentation sponsored by the College of Liberal Arts for The University of Findlay's 125th Anniversary Alumni Lecture Series during her visit to campus Sept. 25-26. A professor of political science at the University of Southern California since 1985, Dr. Sanasarian teaches and does research in the areas of ethnic politics, religion and politics, and women and development, particularly as related to the Middle East and Iran. She is the author of "The Women's Rights Movement in Iran: Mutiny, Appeasement and Repression from 1900 to Khomeini," the Persian translation of which has won the 2007 best book prize by a group of journalists and women's rights activists in Iran. She also has written "Religious Minorities In Iran," now out in paperback. Dr. Sanasarian shared her knowledge of Iran in answering questions from students in Intercultural Communication and Intro to Gender Studies classes and met with various groups of faculty and students. Her evening lecture, "Beyond Fundamentalism: Private Ideals and Public Policy Around the Globe," focused on inspirational stories of individuals in Third World countries who have addressed societal problems from a grassroots level to improve life in their communities. She has traveled in recent years in Israel, Kenya and Tanzania, where she has conducted research funded by several major grants. Dr. Sanasarian came to the United States as a foreign exchange student from Iran to Kent State University for her sophomore year, but ended up earning a degree from Findlay College, thanks to a President's Scholarship for foreign students. A history major, she went on to earn master's and doctoral degrees in political science from the State University of New York at Buffalo. Dr. Sanasarian cited Emily Geer, Ph.D., who taught history and social science at Findlay College from 1964-1977, as her mentor and inspiration. Through a class, Dr. Geer introduced her to the history of the U.S. women's rights movement and served as a positive role model of a woman succeeding in academia, Dr. Sanasarian said. "Her class really changed me. She was always there to encourage me, and I loved the discussions we had," she commented. For more information on Dr. Sanasarian, [click here](#).

- **Brant K. Rhoad '00** grew up planning on a career in medicine. Little did he know that he would end up becoming a lawyer or that his education at The University of Findlay would prepare him for his new career in ways that he had never imagined. Rhoad was the guest speaker for the College of Sciences 125th Anniversary Alumni Lecture on Sept. 17. He spoke to students in a packed Martin Lecture Hall in Brewer Science Hall on the topic of “The Science of Law.” Rhoad is an associate attorney with Scherner and Sybert, L.L.C. in Powell, Ohio, where he is a personal injury lawyer. He also represents and counsels employers with the Ohio Workers’ Compensation System. He recalled that golf coach Al Baker recruited him to The University of Findlay out of Elmwood High School in Bloomdale, Ohio, with a golf scholarship. He told how after going through three and a half years as a biology major, he decided that he didn’t want to go into medicine after all. Rhoad said he dreaded disappointing his adviser, Linda Peck, D.V.M., professor of biology, but was amazed and grateful when she immediately went about helping him achieve his new objective of getting into law school. Rhoad passed the LSAT and was accepted at his choice of The Ohio State University Moritz College of Law. In addition, he received an OSU golf scholarship that was sponsored by Jack Nicklaus to help pay his way. Rhoad emphasized that every day he uses his undergraduate education more than his law degree. His College of Science training in biology, chemistry, physics, anatomy, physiology and medical terminology has helped him understand accidents, decipher doctor’s reports, and on one occasion, enabled him to solve the mystery of a woman’s death, which he found was caused by a nurse administering the wrong medication. A resident of Powell, Ohio, Rhoad maintains his connection with The University of Findlay by serving as a member of the Central Ohio Diplomacy Regional Alumni Committee and has helped organize alumni events, including an annual alumni golf outing in the Columbus area. “If there is nothing else that I learned from being here (The University of Findlay) for four years, it’s that the University supports you,” Rhoad said.

## **5. Oiler Sports**

- The Oilers **football team** is off to a 2-3 start under the guidance of first-year head coach Jon Wauford. Senior running back Joel McDaniel set a new school record with 42 carries for 229 yards in Findlay’s 35-28 overtime win over Wayne State on Sept. 22. Red-shirt junior defensive back Jordan Marshall also broke school records, setting new marks in kick-off returns with six and kick-off return yards with 181 in a 34-3 loss to the University of Indianapolis on Sept. 29.
- **Men’s golf** has a great start to the season, finishing in the top six of every event thus far. Senior Eric Atsma, junior Kory Kotterman and freshman Joe McGeean have starred for the Oilers with five top-10 finishes between them. At the Ferris State Invitational Sept. 16, Kotterman tied for first to lead Findlay.
- The **women’s golf team** has finished in the top five in each of the past four events. On Sept. 10, Findlay won the Jon P. Speiss Memorial Tournament. Freshman Andrea Vogt captured medalist honors with an 81.
