Happy New Year! As we welcome 2025, the faculty, staff, and students of The University of Findlay's Physical Therapy programs wish you and your team a year filled with health and success.

As we reflect on 2024, we experienced a few changes within our Physical Therapy department. Dr. Sharon Walsh and Dr. Debbie George retired after more than 25 years of dedicated service to our programs. Additionally, Dr. Joyce Lammers, our Program Chair, also retired. We extend our heartfelt appreciation to these esteemed faculty members for their contributions and wish them a fulfilling retirement.

We are excited to introduce Dr. Angie Huber as our new Program Chair. Dr. Huber, who has been part of our DPT faculty for seven years, brings valuable experience to her new role. She has served as Associate Chair for the Weekend PTA to DPT Bridge Program and was just recently recognized with the Founders' Academic Excellence Award for Faculty at our 2024 University Awards presentation. 2024 also marked the welcoming of the following new faculty members.

Dr. Andrea Richards, PT, DPT- Dr. Richards earned her DPT degree from the University of Nevada in 2012. Andrea has a variety of practice experiences in outpatient and acute care PT. She is an ABPTS Board Certified Clinical Specialist in Neurologic Physical Therapy and LSVT Big Certified clinician.

Dr. Paul Colbert, PT, DPT- Dr. Colbert earned his DPT degree from Clarkston University in 2017. Following, he successfully completed a neurologic residency at Nova Southeastern University. Paul is an ABPTS Board Certified Clinical Specialist in Neurologic Physical Therapy and LSVT Big Certified clinician.

Dr. Alex Rospert, PT, DPT- Dr. Rospert is a 2017 graduate of the University of Findlay traditional DPT Program. Alex completed the orthopedic PT residency at Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus, OH, and he has continued to work with NCH in the sports and orthopedic therapies department for the past seven years. Dr Rospert also served as a faculty member and coordinator for the orthopedic PT residency for two years.

Dr. Ben Cooksey, PT, DPT- Dr. Cooksey earned his DPT degree from Cleveland State University in 2014. Prior to joining the UF faculty team, Ben worked for several years in a hospital-based outpatient orthopedic practice. Within the practice, he contributed to an orthopedic manual PT residency and worked with patients with persistent pain, concussions, headaches and post operative recovery needs. *Dr. Melanie Thurmond, PT, DPT-* Dr. Thurmond is a 2015 graduate of the University of Findlay Weekend PTA to DPT Bridge Program. Before joining the faculty team at UF, Melanie served as the Rehab Director and a treating clinician in a hospital that also offered outpatient physical therapy services. Looking ahead, the traditional DPT program will continue to use the Exxat system for clinical education onboarding and assignment processes in 2025, except for those clinical partners using their own onboarding systems. The Exxat program will also be used for March mailings and clinical requests for 2026. An exciting update for the PTA to DPT Bridge program is the adoption of the Exxat system, which will help streamline the process of requests, assignments, and onboarding. Starting in 2025, Exxat will be used for clinical education onboarding and assignment processes, except for clinical partners that have their own onboarding systems. The Exxat system will also be utilized for March mailings and clinical requests for 2026. Any <u>new clinical sites</u> will be contacted before March to assess their interest in hosting and to initiate contracts. The DPT program **2024 accomplishments** have included the following:

- The Integrated Clinical Experience (ICE) course series continued with a local clinical site where 2nd year Bridge Program DPT students participated in wheelchair evaluations. First year Bridge Program DPT students utilized their clinical sites of employment to conduct examination and evaluation observations and participation.
- Second year Traditional Program DPT students hosted a six-week Orthopedic Pro Bono Clinic held in Fall 2024 for adults with orthopedic dysfunctions under the guidance of Dr. Dave Verhoff, Dr. Josiah Parkhurst, and Dr. Heather Swain.
- Third year Traditional Program DPT students hosted a six-week Neurological Pro Bono clinic which focused on adults and children with neurological issues under the guidance of Dr. S. Fleming Walsh.
