These courses must be completed with a “C” or higher, there may be no more than two grades of (C), and the grade point average for all of these courses must be 3.0 out of 4.0 or higher.

1. Prerequisite courses taken at other colleges or universities may be deemed equivalent to courses taken at The University of Findlay by the Office of the Registrar and the PA program chair.
2. Courses successfully completed within the last five years are recognized as ideal
3. Courses completed 10 or more years prior to application to the program are generally considered to have exceeded the program statutory limits
 - a. Exceptions to the statutory limits without taking a placement examination may be made on a case-by-case basis
4. Courses that fall within the ten or more year limit include
 - a. Biology
 - b. Chemistry
 - c. Physics
 - d. Medical terminology
5. In general, it is recommended that courses taken more than 10 years ago should be repeated
 - a. A prospective applicant may challenge the course content to demonstrate a minimum proficiency in a subject by taking a proficiency examination administered by The University of Findlay (if available) and scoring $\geq 80\%$ or at the discretion of the Program Director
6. Any coursework in progress after submission of the CASPA application must be completed with a “C” or higher and maintain the required minimum overall GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale in order to be eligible for admission into the program
