

Dr. William Ruse (1934-2022)

Dr. William Ruse passed away in August 2022 at the age of 88. For anyone who is a native of this region of Ohio, the name Dr. William "Bill" Ruse is well known. For those who may not have known him, Bill was a living example of service to his community, and a foundational member of many long-standing institutions. To the University of Findlay and the College of Pharmacy, Bill was a dear friend and driving force in the College. He and former UF President Dr. DeBow Freed worked closely with our founding dean, Don Stansloski, as well as with John Stanovich and Pat Malone to champion the case for the establishment of a college of pharmacy at UF.

Dean Debra Parker reminisced, "He served as the chair of our advisory board for many years, served as an adjunct professor teaching pharmacy economics and administration, and was an extremely generous donor to our program for the last two decades; frankly, we wouldn't be here without Bill and his vision and support. He was a dear friend to many of us, and I am so very sad that he is gone, but WHAT a life well-lived, and what an impact he has had on so many in the campus community as well as the city of

Findlay itself."

The 2022 Arch Ceremony

First-year pharmacy students beginning their college career marched through the University of Findlay Arch on a beautiful, sunny August day. They were cheered by the faculty, staff, cheerleaders, and band as they processed with their UF Pharmacy bucket hats proudly displayed to mark their place in the College of Pharmacy. Earlier that day, twelve first professional year students that were transferring into the program also marched through the arch to keep the tradition going for all of our students coming to UF.

The Griffith Memorial Arch was commissioned in 1923 in memory of Caddie Griffith by her parents. It was widened in 1990 to allow more students to safely pass through to commemorate them joining the University community by entering the arch from Main Street to campus. Legend warns against going through the arch again until graduation, at which time the new alums walk through the arch again, this time leaving the University to do their important work in the world. This is a time-honored tradition at the University of Findlay.



Career Fair 2022

Thursday, September 15, 2022 was a big day for the College of Pharmacy's Experiential Department and the P4, P5, and P6 students. The University of Findlay College of Pharmacy hosted its annual Career Fair on that day, and it was a success for both employers and students!

Thirty-eight employers attended, including 25 hospitals, eight community pharmacies, and other employers including those with fellowship programs, the University's Telehealth Center, a non-profit focusing on healthy lives for all members of the family, a drug and medical device contract resource organization (CRO), and an entity that future grads with various health-care related industries, including biotechnology and biomedicine. The

health care systems that have residencies were able to share details about the residency process as well as their expectations for residents. Several community-based employers conducted interviews with many of our P6 students while the P4 and P5 cohorts researched different organizations for experiential education placement.

The P6 students took their first practice NAPLEX test and attended a professional etiquette luncheon. After the luncheon, they joined a professional development session to learn about fellowships and residencies, the biotechnology sector, and financial decisionmaking.

After the Career Fair, most of the Hub Site attendees stayed for the Hub Site preceptor meeting, where they received updates about the APPE program as well as the College itself. To round out the day, pharmacists were invited to join the P6 students for the "Safety in Technology" CE program led by Dr. Michele Holey PharmD, the Medication Safety Officer for the Mount Carmel Health System. Medication Collection

On Saturday, August 13th, 2022, Dr. Tim Burkart and a team of UF pharmacy students participated in a Medication Collection that took place at Blanchard Valley Hospital in Findlay, OH. This was a joint effort between the University of Findlay College of Pharmacy, Blanchard Valley Health System's (BVHS) Pharmacy, Hancock County Alcohol, Drug Addiction & Mental Health Services (ADAMHS), and the Findlay Police Department. In addition to being full-time faculty in the college and Assistant Director of Experiential Education, Dr. Burkart serves as a member on the ADAMHS Board's Opiate Task Force and Hancock

County's Opioid Fatality Review
Board, and has a clinical practice
site at BVHS focusing in
anticoagulation management. He
works with the ADAMHS Board, local
law enforcement, and various
community partners to set up
medication collections multiple times
a year throughout the Findlay area.

At this three-hour collection event, 52 cars come through the drop-off area, turning in over 139 pounds of unused or expired medications from the Hancock County region. In addition to coordinating safe disposal of the medications turned in, the group also provided information about support programs for recovery and substance use disorder, as well as Deterra® bags (a product that allows for safe disposal of medication at home). The next medication collection event is set for October 29th, 2022 in conjunction with the DEA's National Medication Takeback Day. It will take place from 8 am to 12 pm at the Findlay Municipal Building and will once again include participants from the College's faculty, staff, and students, the ADAMHS Board, and local law enforcement.



Congratulations to UF's Newest Inductees to Rho Chi!

As the academic honor society in pharmacy, the Rho Chi Society encourages and recognizes excellence in intellectual achievement, stimulates critical inquiry to advance pharmacy, contributes to the development of intellectual leaders, promotes the highest ethical standards, and fosters collaboration.
